Introducing Pate's Grammar School

Pate's Grammar School is a co-educational selective state grammar academy in Cheltenham, Gloucestershire, with 1,100 day pupils aged 11 to 18 on roll. We are a modern school with ancient traditions - the school was founded in 1574 with a fund bestowed to Corpus Christi College, Oxford by Richard Pate, Commissioner for King Henry VIII, King Edward VI and Queen Elizabeth I.

Pate's has a long tradition of providing students with a free first-class education, regardless of their background. In our most recent Ofsted inspection which looked at Achievement, Curriculum, Teaching and Learning, Leadership and Management, and the overall effectiveness of education, it was judged that Pate's was 'Outstanding in every category'. The Ofsted report identified Pate's as "one of the top performing schools nationally" and came shortly after the school's recent award of *Sunday Times' State Secondary School of the Year*.

We are among the schools at the very top of the national league tables in respect of our outstanding exam results; we feature in independent studies highlighting the excellent progress students make between key stages, and the calibre of their university choices when they leave. But, for our students, what really matters is the freedom to be themselves, with good friends, lots of extra activities, societies and new ideas to share and explore.

Corporate Sponsorship Objective

In common with many Gloucestershire schools in recent years, Pate's has suffered from an increasing gap in education funding that has put huge pressure on our budget. As a consequence, in 2016 the school took the decision to increase Year 7 pupil numbers to generate additional income. In order to accommodate this growth in pupil numbers, we submitted a bid to the Education and Skills Funding Agency to expand and develop the campus and in April 2017, were granted funds of almost £3m to allow us to do this.

The redeveloped campus will have at its heart, a brand new Sixth Form Centre with a dedicated senior library, group and private study space, staff-student offices and a strength and conditioning suite. The building will be physically linked by a bridge to the Tatum Block which houses existing Sixth Form subject classrooms. The funding will also enable the school to refurbish the areas vacated by the move of existing facilities to provide additional, much needed classrooms in the main school block, a performance space and a new science laboratory.

Whilst we have secured the funding for the build works for the new facility, sadly the grant does not cover the costs to fit out the new and vacated spaces with the necessary furniture, equipment and IT. We are therefore looking to raise funds to allow us to complete what will be an outstanding expansion and redevelopment of our teaching and learning facilities. We intend to raise funds by partnering with businesses, charitable trusts and alumni to support the school and secure naming rights within both the new and refurbished facilities.

The Sixth Form Centre and Library

Pate's Sixth Form is an exciting place to be. At that time in their lives when students are beginning to think about what their future might hold, and what impact they will have on the world, Pate's Sixth Form is a seedbed for big ideas and ambitious plans. These two years are a time to learn new ways of working, in preparation for the independence of university or other training opportunities; students are encouraged to take more responsibility for their studies, proactively seeking out knowledge to enhance their understanding beyond the curriculum. We depend upon our sixth form students to be role models for the rest of the school; they are our best ambassadors and we are unfailingly proud and awestruck at their maturity, energy and creativity.

We take learning and study seriously. With two floors of group and private study spaces, designed for both collaborative and independent learning, the new centre will for the first time, create a senior school hub and give our expanded Sixth Form a cohesive centre.

The Refurbishment Programme

By transferring the Sixth Form to their own designated centre, the existing Lower Sixth common room will be transformed into a much needed performance space whilst the Upper Sixth common room will become a future science laboratory. The vacated library area and Sixth Form study centre will be put to use as a junior library, IT lab and classrooms. The expanding numbers in the Lower School will benefit greatly from this extra space and the opportunities it will give to them in their learning.

Sustainability

The building and refurbishment has full planning permission and has been designed by Quattro Design Architects in Gloucester (www.quattro.co.uk) and specifically Joyce Clifford, a former pupil of Pate's Grammar School for Girls. The design ensures good levels of insulation, efficient lighting, natural ventilation and low water usage (in toilets and taps). There will be some recycling of old fittings within the refurbishment programme.


