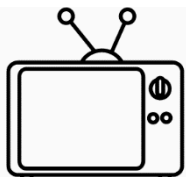


GET READY FOR:

3. Sign up to <https://twitter.com/edulearnspanish> and learn 3 new words a day.



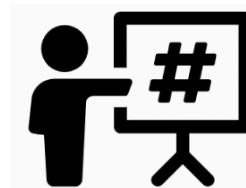
RESEARCH
